Local Educational Agencies (LEAs) must respond to this survey to generate ARP-HCY State Reserve funds.

LEAs are facing unprecedented increases in homeless students which include migrant, immigrant, refugee, and asylee students from Afghanistan, Ukraine, and other war torn and economically depressed countries. NYSED will disperse its ARP-HCY state reserve through allocational grants to LEAs with disproportionately high numbers of homeless students who are also defined as migrant, immigrant, refugee, or asylee students.

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Definitions

For the purposes of gathering accurate student level data, the LEA should categorize students who meet the definition of homeless <u>and</u> migrant, immigrant, refugee, or asylee based on the following definitions. To be counted under the ARP-HCY State Reserve Application, a student need only be identified as experiencing homelessness *and* one of the other categories.

<u>Asylee</u>: a person who meets the definition of refugee and is already present in the United States or is seeking admission at a port of entry. (Definition from US Department of Homeland Security.

Eligible Local Educational Agency (LEA): An LEA is eligible to receive funds if it enrolled at least one student from August 1, 2022 through December 31, 2022 who can be categorized as both homeless and one of the following: migrant, immigrant, refugee or asylee and it reports such student(s) in the child count is taken in this application.

Allowable Uses of Funds

ARP-HCY State Reserve funds are intended to supplement the HCY program, and all allowable HCY uses apply to these funds. For more information, LEAs should reference the list of authorized activities in section 723(d) of the HCY statute, 42 U.S.C. § 11433(d). These activities may include any expenses necessary to facilitate the identification, enrollment, retention, and educational success of homeless children and youth, such as, but not limited to:

providing wraparound services (which could be provided in collaboration with and/or through contracts with community-based organizations, and could include academic supports, trauma informed care, social-emotional support, and mental health services);

purchasing needed supplies (e.g., PPE, eyeglasses, school supplies, personal care items);

providing transportation to enable children and youth to attend classes and participate fully in school activities;

purchasing cell phones or other technological devices for unaccompanied youth to enable the youth to attend and fully participate in school activities;

providing access to reliable, high-speed internet for students through the purchase of internet connected devices/equipment, mobile hotspots, wireless service plans, or installation of community Wi-Fi hotspots (e.g., at homeless shelters), especially in underserved communities; paying for short-term, temporary housing (e.g., a few days in a motel) when such emergency housing is the only reasonable option for COVID-safe temporary housing and when necessary to enable the homeless child or youth to attend school and participate fully in school activities (including summer school); and

providing store cards/prepaid debit cards to purchase materials necessary for students to participate in school activities.
